

VISITATION SCHEDULE

1. The non-custodial parent will be granted rights of visitation from 6:00 p.m. on the first and third Friday of each month until 6:00 p.m. on the following Sunday.

2. The non-custodial parent will have visitation on Mother's Day or Father's Day weekend (whichever is appropriate) from 6:00 p.m. on Friday until 6:00 p.m. on Sunday.

3. The non-custodial parent will have visitation commencing on Christmas Day at 3:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. on December 30th.

4. In odd numbered years, the non-custodial parent will have visitation on Memorial Day weekend and Labor Day weekend from 6:00 p.m. on Friday until 6:00 p.m. on Monday.

5. In even numbered years the non-custodial parent will have visitation on Easter weekend from 6:00 p.m. on Friday until 6:00 p.m. on Sunday, and on Thanksgiving weekend from 6:00 on Wednesday until 6:00 p.m. on Friday.

6. During the months of June and July, the non-custodial parent shall have rights of visitation from 6:00 p.m. on the first Friday of the month until 6:00 p.m. on the Sunday following the third Friday of such month.

7. No visitation rights granted, however, shall interfere with the right of the custodial parent to have custody at the following times:

(a) From 6:00 p.m. on December 23rd until 3:00 p.m. on December 25.

(b) Mother's Day or Father's Day weekend (whichever is appropriate) from 6:00 p.m. on Friday to 6:00 p.m. on Sunday.

(c) In even numbered years from 6:00 p.m. on Friday until 6:00 p.m. on Monday for Memorial day and Labor day weekends.

(d) In odd numbered years from 6:00 p.m. on Friday until 6:00 p.m. on Sunday of Easter

weekend, and from 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday until 6:00 p.m. on Sunday for Thanksgiving weekend.

8. The parent not having physical custody on any child's birthday shall have rights of visitation with the child from 3:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. on the child's birthday.

9. The non-custodial parent shall be responsible for the expenses and transportation of visitation and shall pick the child up and return the child to the residence of the custodial parent.

10. The child and custodial parent have no duty or obligation to await the arrival of the non-custodial parent for more than thirty (30) minutes past the designated commencement time for any visitation period. If the non-custodial parent is more than thirty (30) minutes late for any visitation he/she forfeits visitation for that period, unless the non-custodial parent has previously notified the custodial parent of the fact of his/her tardiness, and made arrangements with the custodial parent to commence such visitation period at a later time, which such arrangements must be agreed to by both parties.

11. If, immediately prior to the scheduled time for the commencement of any visitation, a child is or becomes ill, the custodial parent should give twenty-four (24) hour notice, if possible, of such fact to the non-custodial parent, so that appropriate arrangements and plans can be made. Any regularly scheduled visitation which is canceled by reason of the illness of a child shall be made up by the non-custodial parent at a later date to be agreed upon by the parties. The Non-custodial parent should give the custodial parent twenty-four (24) hours notice of any cancellation of scheduled visitation. The time canceled by the non-custodial parent shall be forfeited.

12. This Agreement is based on current residential status of the parties and each party is to keep the other informed of his/her full address, including state, city, street, house number, and

telephone number, if available. Each party shall also notify the other party within five (5) days of changing his/her address, he/she shall, so long as the child remain minors, notify in writing the Clerk of this Court, of his/her full new address and shall furnish the other party a copy of such notice. The notice shall include the Court file number, and the Clerk of this Court shall docket and file such notice in the cause.

13. Further, in the event of a threat, disaster, or other emergency, such as a hurricane, which causes an emergency evacuation, any party who has custody of a minor child (physical custody or while exercising visitation) has a duty to notify the other parent of the location and well being of the minor(s) as soon as reasonably possible.
